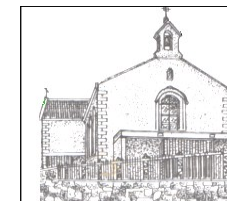

Month of the Holy Souls

Pope's Intention: Let us pray that all parents who mourn the loss of a son or daughter find support in their community, and may receive peace of heart from the Spirit of Consolation.

This month we celebrate the Communion of Saints. It's brilliant, there is so much help available to us! We can join our wandering prayers with those of all those who are closer to God than we are, so that, through them we may reach Him. Saints are people who let in the light—that's what the little child said looking at them in the church stained-glass windows. They challenge us and let us know that it is possible with God's help, to become one of them. We can also unite ourselves with all who may be further away from God than we are, so that through us, they might reach God even though we might think of ourselves as useless! This month, we remember in a special way, all those who have died. We have all the Saints to invoke on 1st and to pray for all the souls on the 2nd. We are all part of the Communion of Saints. "When I prepare myself to say my prayers, I unite myself with all who are closer to God than I am, so that, through them, I may reach God. And I also unite myself to all who may be further away from God than I am, so that, through me they may reach God". (Apostleship of Prayer). There are indulgences to be gained for the souls on making a visit to the Church, praying for the Pope's intentions, and receiving the sacrament of Penance on the week before or after. An indulgence can also be gained by visiting the graveyard during the first week of November. I don't understand much about indulgences, but if they help someone, why not? Someone might remember us some day. "Only when we meet the living God in Christ do we know what life is. We are not some casual meaningless product of evolution. Each of us is a thought of God, each of us is willed, each of us is loved, each of us is necessary" Pope Benedict XVI

I found this and it might help somebody. It is attributed to Pope Francis. It offers a simple and easy to remember way of praying for various intentions

The **thumb** is the finger closest to me. I begin by praying for those closest to me—family and friends, the people I see, meet and think about each day. I will pray especially for a family member or friend who is struggling or who needs a prayer for a special intention.

The next finger is the **index finger**. I pray for those who inspire me and point me in the right direction. Among them, teachers, priests, doctors...they need a prayer to guide them.

The next is the tallest **middle finger**. This reminds me to pray for those who lead our country, our Church, and our world. Those in leadership/ authority need the gifts of the Holy Spirit to help them make the right decisions for the people in their care.

The fourth finger, the **ring finger** is the weakest finger, it reminds me to pray for the people who are weakest—the poor, the sick, the homeless, migrants, those who are on the margins and those in need in any way. They need our prayers and our support.

The little finger, the **luidín**, is the smallest finger. I pray for myself and my own needs. Having prayed for other people and their intentions, I may realise that my needs are quite small by comparison, though still worthy of bringing them to God.

Don't forget all the Saints on Friday November 1st!
We will celebrate St Cecilia on 22nd.

St Laurence O Toole. Diarmaid Mc Murrough was his brother-in-law! He is venerated in Eu Normandy. He died there on his way to Rome. His heart was brought back to Dublin and enshrined in Christ Church Cathedral.

St Albert the Great. He came from Bavaria. He entered the Dominicans and was a distinguished scholar. he excelled in all areas of science, philosophy, and theology.. "The greater and more persistent your confidence in God" he taught "the more abundantly You will receive all that you ask." He guided young St Thomas Aquinas.

We celebrate the dedication of St John Lateran's and that of St Peter and Paul.

We also celebrate the Presentation of Mary. "You, my dear friends, must use your most holy faith as your foundation and build on that, praying in the Holy Spirit" (Jude 20)
